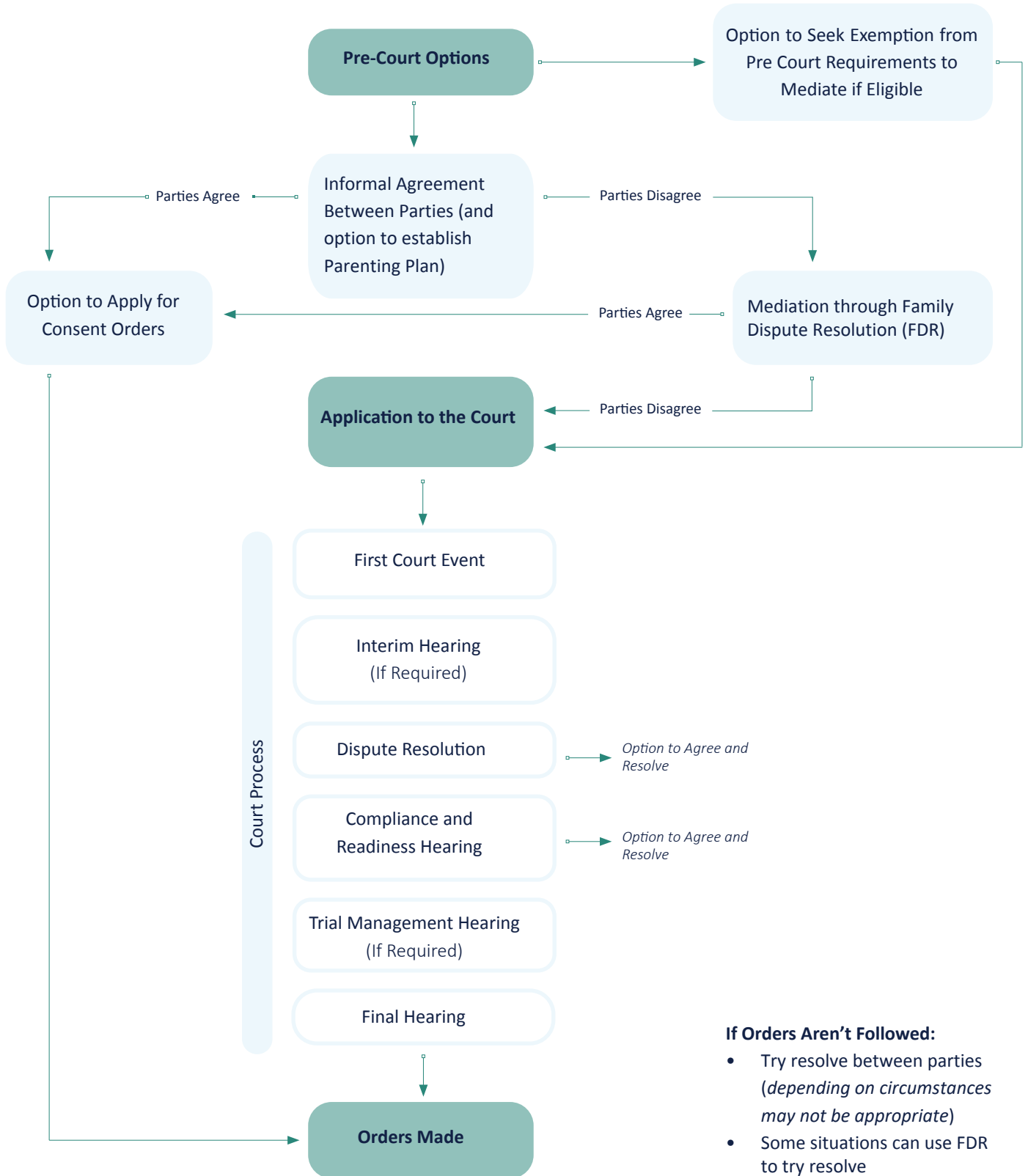


Family Law

If Orders Aren't Followed:

- Try resolve between parties (depending on circumstances may not be appropriate)
- Some situations can use FDR to try resolve
- Otherwise apply to Court

What If I Think the Children Will be in Danger if the Orders are Followed ?

If someone believes their children are in danger, they should call the police and then Child Protection.

In circumstances where your clients:

- want the help of the Court because the other parent isn't complying with a Parenting Order; or
- need to respond to allegations of non-compliance made against them by the other parent; or
- are questioning whether or not they should comply with the Parenting Orders due to identifying serious risks to a child's safety

They should immediately get legal advice

At PCLC we can help them understand their options and set realistic expectations, as well as assisting by assessing any claims and whether or not we could provide any ongoing representation or casework.

We can also try to resolve matters outside of the Court process as much as possible.
