MIGRATION LAW CLINIC

Free legal support for migrants experiencing family violence who are on partner visas







Victims of family violence who have applied for or hold a temporary partner visa can leave an abusive relationship and stay in Australia.

The family violence provisions in the Migration Framework allow a person to continue with their application for permanent residency despite no longer being in a relationship with their Sponsor.

How we can help?

The PCLC Migration Law Clinic team will offer:

- Legal advice and assistance in relation to applying for the family violence provisions
- A strong legal and non-legal referral pathway to provide a holistic service

Who can access the service?

The person referred must:

- be on or have applied for a partner visa
- be experiencing/have experienced or be at risk of family violence
- need support or assistance from a lawyer to continue with their application if they have left or wish to leave the relationship

Free legal advice is available to most people, but ongoing assistance will be subject to:

- the Centre's resources
- the Centre's casework guidelines; or
- the conflict of interest rules

Information & Training

PCLC will deliver training and ongoing supports to build the capacity of family violence and settlement workers to:

- identify the need to get migration advice in the safety planning stage
- identify persons who might be eligible for referral to the clinic
- support applicants in gathering evidence needed to support their application
